- OBSERVATIONS A very good question was brought to our attention the other day. It appears some classes still have some challenges to hurdle while coming up with observations each day. Observations are meant to be a tool for the teachers each week while creating new lesson plans. These notes are class oriented, not individually based like anecdotals. The information written should read as a map of how the curriculum went each day. Completing the observations should be a team effort by all lead teachers in the room. This way you all are aware of how the children are doing and if a teacher is absent, the notes still get done. Here is an example: If you are doing an activity that involves cutting and gluing, observe the children when using the bottles of glue and scissors. If the activity went well, make a note on the observation form that the children did well with scissors and glue. OR... If some of the children had difficulty with the scissors but had fun with the glue you could write, "Josh and Jannie had a hard time using scissors but the class loved the glue." It is a way to help you remember to specifically incorporate more curriculum using scissors. Remember, logging more information on how the children did with the curriculum each day will give you a chance to see where the children need more help, thus giving you more teachable moments.
