Q: Can you clarify the counting requirements for our food sheets? 1) Are we allowed to count a child for a meal or snack if we only serve them a few of the components and not all of them? 2) Does offering a child food mean that we ask them, or do we have to actually place the components in front of the child?

A: 1) "In order to count a child on the food sheet, all components of the meal need to be placed in front of the child." Answered by Dorothy, • KPS CACFP Consultant. 2) "The food MUST be placed in front of the child in order to claim the meal/snack. We do serve....not offer!" • Answered by Mary Lou Davis, CACFP Field Consultant, Indiana Department of Education.

Q: There should be a vote on whether we think the vacation request is working. What works for one business might not work for another. It is taking too long to get around.

A: Melanie and Deb just had this discussion a couple weeks ago about it taking too long. They were frustrated too. Deb has implemented new procedures to help this process. We originally got a late start for the 2009 requests, so we will begin the 2010 requests on October 1, 2009. To make the process move quickly, we will assign each person a date to file their requests. Slips must be turned in that day before 2:00pm in order to update the seniority calendar and post it on our website (see Shared Facts). This should allow us to get through the process in about one and a half months. The new request schedule will also be implemented on Feb. 2nd in continuation of the 2009 requests.

Q: Vacation - It is not set up to be able to take a mental health day, or a spur of the moment long weekend if the opportunity should come up. You have to wait for your turn. How can you plan that type of thing that far ahead.

A: We are also aware this is a problem and this is the new policy. Last minute requests for "personal" days can be filed anytime throughout the year up to 4 weeks in advance. For example, if today is Jan. 28th and you want Feb 6th off for "personal" reasons, you can request that day as long as the calendar says it is open. If today is Jan. 28th and you want March 2nd off, you will need to wait until Feb 9th to turn in your request. You *must* look at the current days-off calendar on the website for open days before you ask for time off. A day or two at a time will be reviewed and authorized when available. If you have questions about a day you want, contact Melanie for help.

Q: Vacation Time - I don't think this new way is working. I have heard lots of complaints. We were not asked our opinion on this matter and did not have a staff meeting to discuss it. If you would honestly go around and talk to the other staff I'm sure I am not the only one that feels this way.

A: We heard <u>lots</u> of complaints the way it was before and that is why I took it to the board. Melanie was <u>always</u> in a no win situation and it was frustrating to have so many people mad about their time off. While this may cause some irritation working this plan through we feel in the long run it is a more equitable plan for everyone. With the above corrections, some of the irritation should ease. If not, feel free to address it again with us.
