Be Creative!

Creativity is thinking, expressing, or putting things together in a new way. Is your child creative? Chances are you say "yes!" Think about these characteristics you might see in your three-or four-year old.

- Young children are naturally curious and adventurous.
- Young children are unself-conscious and open to expressing themselves in a variety of ways. They aren't concerned with being perfect.
- Preschoolers enjoy telling lengthy, imaginative stories.
- Older preschoolers may choose a favorite area of creativity, such as drawing and painting, listening and moving to music, or telling stories and making up songs.

Creative experiences establish feelings of selfconfidence and satisfaction. They help children make decisions, solve problems, and improve language skills. So how can you take a new look at encouraging your child's uninhibited creative spirit?

- Display your child's artwork.
- Tape-record your child's music
- Provide a variety of art supplies, such as clay, markers, all types of paper, paint, fingerpaint, scissors, and glue.
- Give your child enriching experiences at museums and musical concerts.
- Do something creative while your child is watching!
